Introduction

Since the introduction of the Local Policing Community Charter, the rural east safer neighbourhood team have been working to address those priorities identified to Police by partner agencies and the public. There are 19 Parish Councils on the rural east area A number of issues listed below were prioritised over the last three months, and we have worked to address those issues taking actions listed below. We are always keen to hear directly from members of the public so please feel free to contact the team directly anytime to discuss any concerns.



Priority Theft from Farms/ Outbuildings

What have we done?

We are conducting regular high visibility reassurance patrols across the area. We are gathering and submitting intelligence regarding these offences. We are working with Rural Crime Officers and engaging with the community and offering crime prevention advice.

Please note a recent increase in vehicle crime in particular 4 wheel drive vehicles. Please be vigilant and remove keys from vehicle, secure vehicle and park in outbuilding and box in where possible.



Priority - Speeding

Speeding continues to be a major concern for a number of residents and parishes across the Policing area.

What have we done?

This is an ongoing priority where we aim to conduct speed monitoring in every village on our area. We are liaising with and bidding for force support on this issue, seeking specialist motorbike officers to assist with speed enforcement at key locations. So far we have conducted speed monitoring every week in our policing area where problems have been highlighted.





Priority

We have 4 priority open spaces on our Policing area. The purpose of this priority is to ensure everyone feels safe and able to use the open spaces.

Haughmond Hill Lawley Hill and Lodge Hill Bayston Hill Quarry Area Lyth Hill What have we done?

We Continue to conduct daily mobile and foot patrols in these locations, showing a visible presence to deter potential ASB and crime. These patrols will continue until further notice.







People can now keep up to date with local policing news following the launch of a brand new community messaging service for residents living in the West Mercia Police area.

The new system, called Neighbourhood Matters, enables residents, businesses and community groups across Herefordshire, Worcestershire, Shropshire and Telford to find out more about what is happening in their local community. It also gives them the opportunity to contact police officers and local policing teams directly so they can raise any concerns and provide feedback.

It is a free service and those who sign up can choose to receive news and appeals, local crime information and crime prevention advice via a number of different channels.

Assistant Chief Constable Rachel Jones, said: "We are delighted to launch Neighbourhood Matters as a key part of our Local Policing and Community Charter. The new messaging service will help us to work more closely with the public, build strong community relationships and both reduce and prevent crime.

"Our Local Policing and Community Charter, launched in March this year, outlines how we will ensure we provide a visible policing presence within communities. Using local face-to-face engagement, social media and new digital channels, we will create further opportunities for dialogue so the public can raise concerns, provide feedback, be involved and help shape policing.

"Intelligence received from our communities is vital in preventing and detecting crime and antisocial behaviour. Neighbourhood Matters will be another mechanism that people can use to pass on information and concerns, speak directly to local teams and keep up-to-date with policing in their area. By working together to share information we can make a real difference."

The messages people receive will be targeted and based on their location and preferences selected by each individual. The public can sign up for local updates from their neighbourhood policing team, or join a number of specialised community interest groups such as Business Watch, wildlife crime and crime prevention.

We would encourage as many people as possible to sign up for the free alerts where you can see real time messages, crime prevention advice and be aware of any recent crimes or suspicious activity in your area.
